







# WHO WE ARE






### YETU "OURS"

### INITIATIVE

A total of 2 train of trainer staff members were selected for USAID and Aga Khan Foundation 6 month funded YETU training to enhance sustainability through local resource mobilization.

# 2022 Progress

- A total of 36 returning students and youth benefitted from our pilot school sponsorship, holiday tuition, Agribusiness training and social support programs.
- A total of 17 students received full and partial secondary educational scholarships which included 13 girls and 4 boys.
- A total of 3 student leaders are learning basic computer skills in digital safety, basic keyboard skills and virtual communication through in person and virtual school holiday mentoring sessions.



We had **20** school holiday program days with a total of **40** facilitated mentoring sessions in March - April 2022. On average **32** out of **45** expected students attended our daily sessions throughout. New faces came in almost daily, increasing the number to an average of **60** attendees per month. **71.63%** average of **60** attendees per month the returning students benefited from the provided daily holiday snacks, lunch and mentoring sessions which were well attended.

## WHAT WEDO

We are excited about our slow but steady progressive growth as a rural education STEM champion and the impact we have made in the Luanda sub county community especially among young girls and women in the last two years.

Holiday Sciences, Math, secondary school scholarship, Computational thinking and out of school study tuition group programs have gained popularity and interest among our community youth affected by poverty. We have a semi-permanent dedicated Technology and Chemistry teaching member that has made significant in kind contributions of their time in providing holiday mentoring and tutoring. This has seen a consistent improvement in performance for these subjects.

TOPICS COVERED (LEARNED) DURING OUR Q1 HOLIDAY SESSIONS.

- Mathematics -General/basic mathematics and facilitating study group formation discussions.
- English Functional writing skills (Letter writing), composition(essay writing) and facilitating study group formation discussions.
- Biology Parts and function of an eye, connection to vision science career mentors and formation of study group discussions.
- **Chemistry** Organic Chemistry 1, Periodic Table, Structure and Bonding and study group formation discussions.
- Life Skills and Digital Mentorship Traditional Songs & Dances, career choices and related requirements for Graphics and Web Design.

  Tertiary Computer science career opportunities and Scholarships available, related academic, extracurricular requirements and Goal setting (Academic counseling).

### STEM EDUCATION

We implement the InspireHER STEM program model at the Amazing Grace Center Kenya CBO which won the top innovative idea award for inspiring hope, creating joy and igniting potential at the inaugural June 2022 Edinnovate Showcase organized and awarded by the prestigious and coveted University of San Diego, The Jacobs Institute for Innovation in Education.

Among other judging criteria, our solution was considered to be new but more effective than existing solutions.

100% of funds received through STEM education campaigns goes to direct support and payment of school fees, school uniform, mandatory government fees, science, math, digital learning tools, transportation to and from school, classroom teaching resources and digital literacy materials.

These funds are managed in a separate bank account and girls and women are given priority based on economic hardship, academic performance and vulnerability criteria.

We are seeking laptops, smartphones, tablets and technology skills development sponsor partners.

English is not the first language of communication among the villagers, rural teachers and students, majority of whom are comfortable with Luhya the local dialect. This greatly affects the teaching and understanding of technical subjects in Science, Mathematics and Computer studies which affects overall subject interest and mean grade performance. It also affects the students' confidence in effective communication. We rely on education consultants and mentors from various backgrounds for effective holiday academic and life skills development. Our combined volunteer mentor access database has grown from 30 to 40 both in person and virtual mentors that provide life skills, English conversation, digital skills, scholarships, college, Agribusiness and career development skills.

Our youth beneficiaries are required to maintain good behavior, consistent mentoring attendance and a minimum of passing grade and above in ALL school subjects to maintain their social support sponsorship and education scholarships in the programs. We are seeking learning exchange and digital literacy implementing partners.

# INELIHOODS

AGRIBUSINESS EMPOWERMENT


A total of **22** students attended phase one of our Model Agribusiness economic empowerment training which included **15** girls and **7** boys at the end of quarter one in 2022.

In order to sustain our local operations, support continued school fees, tuition programs and school feeding programs, we have initiated a model climate smart agribusiness kitchen and vertical garden maintained by sponsored secondary school students, mentees, benefitting parents, staff members and CBO member volunteers. The phase one training equipped students with knowledge and skills on how to do kitchen gardening by adopting climate smart technologies to produce quality traditional leafy vegetables. It also empowered students and local unemployed youth to embrace kitchen and vertical farming gardening skills as an urban farming method, an extracurricular activity for their career exploration, financial literacy, global learning exchange for exposure and as an income generating activity for the sustainability of organization's programs, youth and women led small space Agribusinesses, seed, equipment and capital access startups. The land space we use is from an in kind donation. We are seeking implementation experts.

We have three main sponsorship categories in which you can become a STEM Education Champion. Payments can be made weekly, fortnightly, monthly or annually.

- USD \$375/Year covers partial secondary education mandatory government fees, holiday tuition, holiday lunch, snacks, sanitary pads and digital safety training.
- USD 750/Year covers full secondary boarding school placement, mandatory fees, tuition, school uniform, stationery supplies, transportation to and from school.
- USD \$1125/Year covers full secondary education, sanitary. pads, Agribusiness training and technical vocational training.

We accept sponsorships from anyone with a genuine interest to make a difference in the life of a rural child or young woman affected by poverty.

This includes but is not limited to donations from mentors, individuals, families, travel groups, social clubs, church groups, corporate organizations, university clubs, and schools.

At least 3 times a year, your student will write a letter/ record a video, provide academic report cards, or their entrepreneural progress throughout their sponsorship period.
